NEW BILLBOARD CODE IN FORCE

Regulation and Licensing Of Roadside Signs Under State Law Explained

There is now a code for billboards. Not an NPA code, but a new state law strictly regulating and licensing all roadside advertising signs...

Free Signs Are Excepted. Signs advertising the sale of farm products on the farmer's own property, roadside advertisements, or signs advertising for sale or rent of land on which they are erected are excepted from the new law...

The penalty for violation of the law, a misdemeanor, ranges up to \$100. "Every billboard," Taylor explained, "must bear a license like an auto license. These will be changed yearly upon the conclusion of the annual license law."

The campaign for regulating roadside advertising was started by Mrs. Charles N. Taylor of Los Angeles, an head of the California Society for the Prevention of Roadside Signs, and was backed by the entire state of the state, the California Supervisors' association and the Farmers' association. In addition to providing for 30-day signs, the outdoor advertising law also decrees that the person posting a sign must have the consent of the owner of the land on which it appears, and must place his own name above the sign for the purpose of identifying his work.

To protect the public against flimsy and serious billboards, there are required to be able to withstand a wind pressure of 30 pounds to the square foot. An old law prohibiting their installation within 100 feet of an intersection or in such a position as to obstruct the motorist's view of the highway for 500 feet is continued in force.

The outdoor advertising inspection service is a division of the state department of public works. It is to help in enforcing the law by locating where the sign poster has failed to respond to a ten-day warning to get a license.

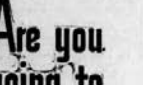

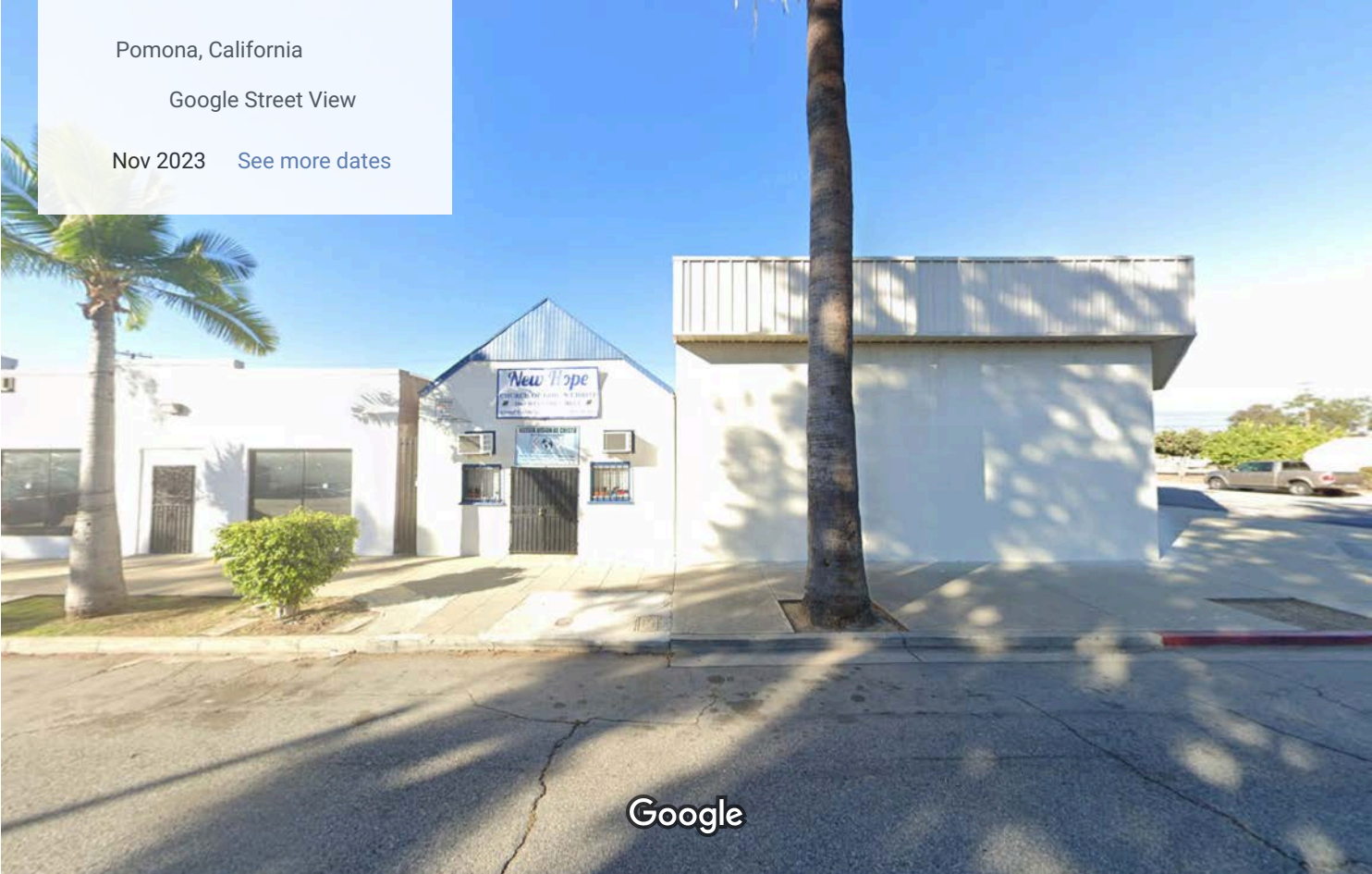
